

# LET'S MAKE UNICORNS!

## INCLUDED IN THE KIT:

- Toilet Paper Roll
- Container of White Paint
- Paint Brush
- Yarn
- Foam Unicorn Horn

## YOU WILL NEED:

- Liquid Glue (Hot glue also works well)
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Coloring utensils of your choice
- For the Pegasus option: paper

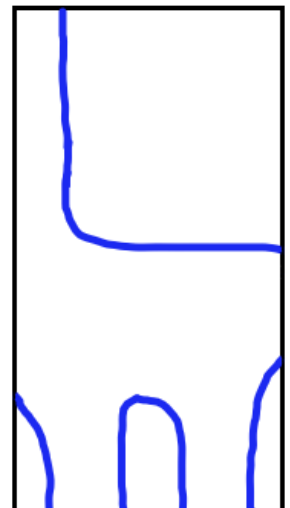
## THINGS TO NOTE:

- A sharpie works best for drawing details on the unicorn face, but other coloring utensils will also work.
- Sometimes, no matter how long you let it dry, paint will bleed onto the marker. If that happens, it can help to have a scrap piece of paper nearby to run the marker across. Most of the paint should come off the marker this way.
- To make a Pegasus instead: between Steps 3 and 4 draw and cut out the wings and attach them to the body with glue. Do not add the horn.

## TO MAKE THE UNICORN:

Step 1: Flatten your toilet paper roll. Grab a pencil and draw your unicorn out like the example to the right. Cut it out, saving the large leftover piece for the next step.

Step 2: Unfold the large leftover piece of toilet paper roll and find a flat spot to draw out the unicorn's head, leaving out the horn, as we will add that later. Then cut it out.



Step 3: Fold down the top part of the neck, and glue the head onto it so it sticks out from the rest of the body.

Step 4: Once the glue has had a minute to dry, paint your unicorn.

Step 5: Let the unicorn dry completely.

Step 6: Once dry, use a marker to draw on any details: eyes, nose, hooves, ears, etc.

Step 7: Now it is time to attach the unicorn horn to the unicorn. Feel free to decorate it if you wish. The foam is sticky on the back, so tear off the bottom piece of backing on the horn and attach it to the top of your unicorn's head. You can also glue it onto your unicorn and not worry about the backing if that's easier.

Step 8: Grab the strings of yarn and line them up. Tie them all in a knot about 1.5-2 inches from the end. Cut the string after the knot. Glue the knot behind the unicorn's head, and bring the short end over the head and horn. Feel free to glue the ends in place. This is your unicorn's mane.

Step 9: Fold the rest of your string in half, twice. Tie a knot in the middle. Cut any loops so each string is straight. Glue the knot inside the unicorn. This is your unicorn's tail. Once dry, trim the yarn any way you wish.

Step 10: Your unicorn is complete! Enjoy!
